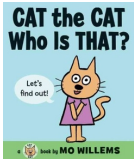

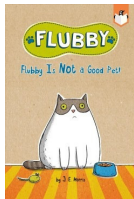
Frog Meets Dog

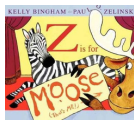


Flubby is Not a Good Pet!

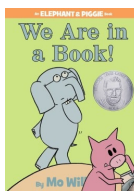
Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus!

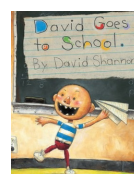


We Are in a Book!

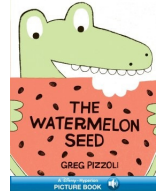

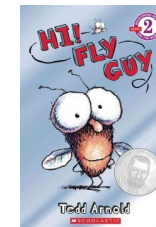


Bark, George

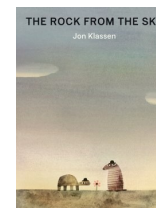


Hi! Fly Guy

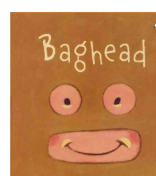


This is Not My Hat

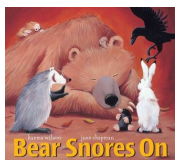

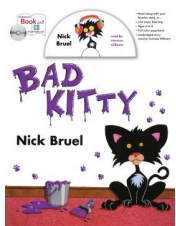


Bear Snores On

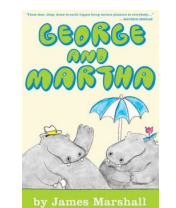


Bad Kitty

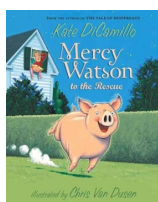


Dog Man

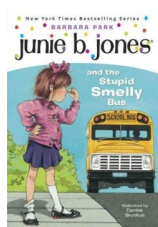


Mercy Watson to the Rescue

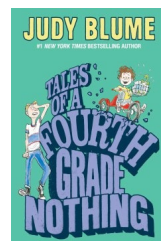


Sideways Stories from Wayside School

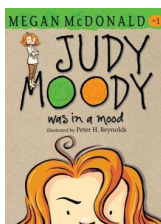


Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing

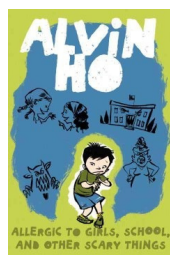
